



## Dress Code

As a delegate, it is your responsibility to dress appropriately and make sure no one feels uncomfortable while attending Family Exchange events. If you choose to dress inappropriately, you will be asked to change. By planning ahead and packing appropriate clothing you will save yourself the inconvenience of being asked to change. Please help in contributing to a pleasant camp atmosphere.

Please be advised that the following dress code will be enforced for not only Delegates, but all Family Exchange staff.

- On group days, the only acceptable dress code is the current years official Best Summer Ever camp T-shirt. Camp T-shirts should not be altered in any way; no cutting, tearing, or changing the color. You are allowed to roll your sleeves up as long as it doesn't break one of the other dress code rules.
- All clothing shall be neat, clean, and in acceptable repair and appearance and to be worn as they were designed in good taste.
- Articles of clothing which display profanity, products or slogans which promote tobacco, alcohol, drugs, sex, gangs, or in any other way are distracting are prohibited.
- Items of clothing which are excessively baggy or tight, expose bare midriffs, bare chest, undergarments (eg. bras/underwear), or that are transparent (see-through) are prohibited.
- Tank tops with straps wider than 2 inches and shorts that are no less than 3 inches above the knee are permitted. Please be advised that spaghetti straps, shirts which expose a bare back, halter tops, and tube tops are prohibited.
- Swimming (For all water recreation):
  - Swimsuits for boys: swim trunks only (No shorts, cut-off pants, or speedos).
  - Swimsuits for girls: One-piece suits are recommended, however, two-piece suits are allowed as long as they are modestly cut. No string, thong or crochet suits will be allowed
  - Swimsuits may only be worn during swimming activities
